A Moment with Mike

The season of Advent is here. This fourweek season, leading up to the celebration of Christmas, is a time of anticipation as we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth, recognize that in Christ, God is with us, and seek to live in such a way that we are ready when he returns. Of course, in our culture, preparations begin long before Advent. Those who own retail businesses



know that they have to prepare for their Christmas inventory plenty early to be ready in time, grocery stores need to stock their Christmas themed food, and some radio stations play Christmas music starting the day after Halloween! Some are annoyed by this, although it is hardly a moral failing.



As we officially enter Advent now, Christmas music will begin in our church as well. Many of you have favorite Christmas hymns. Some are well known, and others less so, but regardless of when we prefer Christmas music to get started, many of us like it when the time is right. That's why I am excited to let you know that we will be focusing on Christmas hymns in this year's Advent sermons. In some ways, this is a continuation of the Advent sermon series from 2022, except we will focus on a new batch of hymns. Each week, we will focus on one hymn and see what the lyrics have to tell us about the meaning of the Christmas story.

One of my favorite Christmas hymns, which just so happens to not be in our hymnal, is "O Holy Night." In the first verse, it says, "A thrill of hope—the weary world rejoices." Do you feel as though our world is weary right now? I think most of us do! We have been through so much in these last few years with wars abroad and division in our country. Regardless of where you stand on our cultural issues, I think we can all agree that we are weary. "O Holy Night" tells us that the world was weary back then too, and yet, the weary world rejoiced at the thrill of hope brought to them in the announcement of the birth of Jesus.

I think it's safe to say that our weary world needs a thrill of hope as well. The good news of Christmas is that this holiday is a thrill of hope each year, if we allow it to be so. God has not given up on us. He didn't then, and he doesn't now. In spite of a world weary from the effects of sin and brokenness, God came to bring us hope and salvation. So, hopefully, in the midst of our weariness, we can find a thrill of hope in the birth of Jesus Christ.

The Advent studies will be reading the book The Christmas Letters: Celebrating Advent with Those Who Told the Story First by Magrey DeVega. The letters in the New Testament, known as the Epistles, contain the first attempts by the church to understand and celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation. They point us to the origins of what we believe about Jesus—fully human and fully divine. By spending time with these holy, ancient words this Advent, you'll come to know the meaning of Christ's coming like never before. Read the New Testament letters, Romans, 1 John, Philippians, and Colossians as your first Christmas letters of the season, and find within them an invitation from God to deepen your understanding of the Incarnation and embrace a fuller commitment to Jesus Christ.

Action Items



Response Needed About Newsletters



We are thinking about our financial resources and considering a change to our monthly newsletters. Currently, we have a bulk mail permit, which requires that we send 200 units to receive the reduced cost of \$0.208 per newsletter for local

addresses and \$0.236 per newsletter for out of area newsletters. We spend around \$43 each month, plus the annual bulk mail fee, which was \$320 in 2024. In addition to mailing those newsletters. Jennifer also emails the newsletter as a PDF to 217 email addresses, posts it on our Facebook page, Pastor Mike posts it on our website, and physical copies are available outside the office and in the narthex. In 2024, the number of people wanting a physical copy mailed to them has decreased, in part due to deaths, and we now have to send quite a few newsletters back to the church address to meet the 200 required for bulk mail. We are considering the option of letting our bulk mail permit expire. This would mean that those wanting a physical copy of the newsletter would need to pick one up on a Sunday. We could also mail—with a \$0.73 first-class stamp—a limited amount to those who are homebound or out of the area and don't have email, Facebook, or website access. As we consider this option, we would like to know a good estimate of how many people would still need a physical copy mailed to them. If 95 households or less need a physical copy mailed to them, we would save money going with first-class stamps verses going with bulk mail. Again, we would continue having physical copies available in the narthex and outside the office and would continue emailing copies and having them available

online. When this announcement was posted in the November newsletter, only two people contacted the office to request that the newsletter still be physically mailed to them. If



you would only be able to access the newsletter by having one physically mailed to you, please contact the office as soon as possible, so we can make an informed decision.





