



# Flood Recovery Updates

#### **Financial Assistance Provided by St. Paul's**

As of July 14th, our congregation has been the steward of \$10,122.26 to assist with flood recovery.

- \$3,874 will be deposited in the community flood recovery fund at Central Bank on July 31st.
- \$5,248.26 (\$3,248.26 from our local disaster relief fund combined with the \$2,000 disaster relief grant from the Iowa Annual Conference) has been given to individuals and businesses linked to St. Paul's who were directly impacted by the flood.
- \$500 was given to a specific member of our congregation, per the donor's request.
- \$500 was placed in our St. Paul's disaster relief fund • for future flood needs.
- Stay tuned to the Sept. newsletter for the total given to Grace UMC in Spencer and their pastoral family.

#### **Messages of Support Received**

Denison UMC has been praying for Cherokee, and their pastor, Curt R. Copple delivered seven prayer shawls for the families in our congregation who were directly impacted by the flood. Their "Prayer Shawl Ministry was made for you to bring comfort to know you are loved and you are in our prayers."

Fear not, for God is with us even amidst the waters. Let our faith be stronger than any floodwaters, knowing His promises endure forever.


