

The General Conference of The United Methodist Church ended on May 3rd. and as many of you know, significant decisions were made. In particular, the sentence that says that the practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching was removed from our Book of Discipline, the ban on ordaining "self-avowed practicing homosexual" clergy was removed, and conducting a same-sex wedding is no longer a chargeable offense for clergy. In other words, LGBTQIA+ individuals may be ordained, and pastors will not be charged for officiating or for not officiating at a same sex wedding.

The General Conference effectively made our Book of Discipline neutral on the subject and is letting each local church and each pastor decide what is best for them, which allows The United Methodist Church to hold space for differing opinions by avoiding broad mandates or bans. Nothing passed by General Conference would compel churches to receive a gay pastor. The legislation approved also explicitly protects the right of clergy and churches not to officiate at or host same-sex weddings. Pastors have the authority to decide when and for whom they will officiate a marriage, and congregations have the right to determine whether such ceremonies will be held on church property.

In the weeks following General Conference, we held two informational Q&A sessions here at St. Paul's to share the results of General Conference with anyone who wished to learn more and for congregants to ask questions about how it will affect us in the local church.

The Iowa Conference of The United Methodist Church has made it clear that local churches default to the traditional position that marriage is between a man and a woman and is encouraging local churches to come up with a process for how this position might change if we were to want to consider allowing same-sex weddings within the church building in the future. Our Administrative Board recently met and passed a marriage policy that acknowledges that St. Paul's currently holds to a traditional view of marriage and outlines a process for how this position might change, if someone were to ask us to consider it.

If a member or pastor of St. Paul's requests that the current position on marriage be modified, the process passed by the board is as follows. First, the Administrative Board would vote on a motion to revise our marriage position, which would need an affirmative vote of two thirds of the members of the board. If that happens, then the next step would be to present the motion to the members of the congregation to vote on at a meeting called for that purpose. Notice of this meeting must be given no less than twenty days beforehand. If two thirds of the members of the congregation vote to change the church's position, then it would be changed. Members of the board feel this process gives everyone ample notice and an opportunity to be heard.

Our congregation is pretty much evenly split on this issue according to a survey in 2021, and so I imagine that some of you on the more traditional side may feel relieved by the current position of St. Paul's and to know that any change would involve everyone's input. I also know that there are many of you on the progressive side who may be grieving that change has not already taken place at the local level, because you know of people—perhaps even in your own family—who are affected by this. We are a people in process. What I can say is that as we went through the Q&As and the board meeting, people were present from both sides, and we were able to listen to one another, have grace-filled conversation, and to ultimately pass a policy that acknowledges where we are and that leaves the door open for the future.
